

What to do if you test positive for COVID?

- This applies to all individuals, regardless of vaccination status
- Isolate for 5 days
- If after 5 days you are asymptomatic or symptoms are resolving AND you have been without a fever for 24 hours, you are eligible to return to school
- Must test negative prior to returning
 - Schedule testing with our front office or at the medical facility of your choice.

What should you do if you're exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID?

- Let our office know! We are participating in the Test to Stay program, which allows your child to attend school if he/she is not symptomatic.
- If your child is showing symptoms at any time, assume they're positive and stay home for 5 days.
 - Arrange testing with our office to return to school
- If they <u>do not</u> have symptoms, we will test your child at least twice during the 5 days following their exposure. If they remain negative, they can continue to come to school.

We are continuing to use the following measures to help reduce the spread of COVID:

- Masking
- Distancing and Cohorting
- Ventilation
